

End the day with a swim or a walk at the Lake of Sillé. Enjoy the many activities on site to relax and have fun.





### Coco Plage, 100 years of history

### **I924**

Under the approving gaze of the Duchess of Uzès, the owner of the forest, Gabriel Richefeu sets up a shack on the edge of the lake. He opens a guinguette (a riverside tavern) on Sundays. The success is immediate, and everyone rushes to gather at Coco's!

### 1925

The forest is sold by the Duchess of Uzès to the State. However, she, who has a special affection for Gabriel Richefeu, imposes one condition: to keep the tourist facilities near the pond.

This leads to the construction of beach cabins, a wooden horse carousel, and the development of water activities with the help of sports associations.

### **•** 1944

A bombing destroys all the infrastructure that had been set up. The Richefeu family (Gabriel Richefeu, his wife and their children) decide to rebuild everything: a café-restaurant, a game room, a souvenir shop, and more...

### **1947**

The Lake of Sillé becomes a classified natural site.

### **1**969






### Why « Coco » Plage?

The name 'Coco Plage' (or Coco Beach) comes from its founder, Gabriel Richefeu, who was nicknamed Coco. A poultry and fish merchant, he is the one who initiated the site's tourist development. As a child, when his mother would take him to the lake, she would say to him, 'You see, my little Coco, anyone who sets up a restaurant by the water would make a good living!'

It is therefore thanks to this affectionate nickname 'Coco,' given to him by his family and friends, that the site naturally built its reputation. People would go to 'Coco,' which later became 'Coco Plage.'





### A classified and protected natural site

### A distinctive landcape

The Sillé forest massif partly covers the Coëvrons mountain range and entirely spans a narrow, elongated hill oriented North-East / South-West, with an elevation ranging from 140 m to 292 m. Its very rugged terrain is crossed by three deep valleys: those of the Roullée, Jouteau, and Desfays streams.

### A protected site


The Sillé state forest is entirely included in the type 2 ZNIEFF (Sillé-le-Guillaume Forest and Pezé Woods), and six type 1 ZNIEFFs (limited areas characterized by their remarkable biological interest) are also present. ZNIEFFs (Zones of Natural Interest for Flora and Fauna) are natural areas listed due to their exceptional character.

The lake loop has also been a classified site since 1947 for its landscapes, by the DREAL (Regional Directorate for the Environment, Planning, and Housing).

### A Natura 2000 designated site

A remarkable site of the department, classified since 1947, the Grand Pond of Sillé-le-Guillaume owes its protection to its water expanse, which is uncommon in the region, to the high quality of the surrounding landscapes, and also to its local fame. This site was early identified as a picture que location, ideal for walks and local tourism, as evidenced by the numerous recreational facilities along its shores.

The classification, which recognizes its picturesque interest, aims to preserve its landscape and heritage qualities.





## The Normandie-Maine Regional Natural Park and UNESCO Global Geopark



### **WHAT IS A**UNESCO Global Geopark?

UNESCO Global Geoparks are areas where landscapes and geological sites of international significance are preserved and promoted. These areas are managed in a way that balances environmental protection, education, and sustainable development. In a UNESCO Global Geopark, the geological heritage, linked with the region's other natural and cultural riches, is highlighted to raise public awareness of today's key issues. This includes themes such as the responsible use of natural resources, combating climate change, and preventing risks related to natural disasters. By discovering the local geological history and its impact on modern society, visitors become aware of the importance of this heritage, while local residents feel a great sense of pride in their territory.

#### NORMANDIE-MAINE RECOGNIZED AS A UNESCO GLOBAL GEOPARK SINCE 2024

After a long application process led by the Normandie-Maine Regional Natural Park and all its partners, the territory was awarded the UNESCO Global Geopark label in March 2024! This label is granted for 4 years and is then subject to a new evaluation. This involves a continuous dynamic effort from stakeholders to maintain this recognition.

### **EMBARK ON THE DISCOVERY OF**UNESCO Global Geopark Normandie-Maine

In the heart of a peaceful countryside where hamlets, villages, meadows, fields, and forests intertwine, the UNESCO Global Geopark Normandie-Maine will captivate both young and old. Come explore its hidden treasures! Rocky cliffs, steep slopes, rushing waters, scree slopes, viewpoints, and rugged natural sites are just some of the wonders that define the identity of this territory. These landscapes are the legacy of a long history, beginning 600 million years ago. It then erodes slowly to shape the landscapes that our ancestors and we live alongside today.

Through photos, trophies, press articles, and collectible items, you can admire the history of the USS, a historic club founded in 1911, as well as discover its rival, Entente Silléenne 1970, and the history of US Rouessé-Vassé 1947, a neighboring club.

### Hiking and mountain biking trails



#### The Sillé state forest

"Perched on a long, narrow ridge, in the departments of Sarthe and Mayenne, within the Normandie-Maine Regional Natural Park and Geopark, the Sillé state forest covers 3,376 hectares. A remnant of the ancient massif that once covered the Coëvrons region, the forest has undergone numerous transformations throughout history, linked to the development of human activity. Today, the forest is composed of half broadleaf trees (mainly sessile oak, chestnut, beech) and half conifers (pine, Douglas fir, spruce, fir).

The Sillé forest massif partly covers the Coëvrons mountain range and entirely covers a narrow, elongated hill, oriented Northeast/Southwest, with an altitude ranging from 140 m to 292 m. Its very accentuated relief is crossed by three deep valleys: those of the streams of Roullée, Jouteau, and Desfays.

Two marked trail running routes will allow you to cover a total of 40 km in the forest. Starting from the large parking lot, take the Rochebrune circuit (18.2 km) and the Chapelle Lamarre circuit (21.4 km).

### The GR® (long-distance hiking trails)

The Champagne Conlinoise and Sillé region has two GR® trails on its territory: the GR® 36 and its variant, the GR® 365.

The GR® 36 follows the trails through the towns of Mont-Saint-Jean, Sillé-le-Guillaume, Saint-Rémy-de-Sillé, and Pezé-le-Robert. The new GR® de Pays des Alpes Mancelles follows part of this route, including 21 km within our territory. It is now possible to connect the two GR® trails from the Sillé-le-Guillaume train station.

The GR® 365 follows the trails through the towns of Sillé-le-Guillaume, Le Grez, Rouessé-Vassé, Rouez, Tennie, Bernay-Neuvyen-Champagne, and Ruillé-en-Champagne. It crosses the Petite Charnie Green Station from north to south, passing through almost all of its villages.

### 1,000 years of history

Push open the doors of the Sillé-le-Guillaume fortress, rich in 1,000 years of history. The castle was originally assigned to the defense of the County of Maine. Wars were part of its daily life, and it became one of the strongholds of the Hundred Years' War, where the French and English fought for its possession.

The castle has had several lives. From 1804 to 1971, this historic landmark was transformed into a school and later a high school. From July 5th to September 21st, the castle comes to life with tours and activities organized by the city's heritage service and the Sillé Culture association. You will be amazed by the rich history of this historical monument, classified in 1889.





### Arsène Marie Lefeuvre

The remarkable Beauvau tower commands the fortifications and dominates the town of Silléle-Guillaume with its imposing structure. An exhibition, set up in the Pressigny tower, is dedicated to Arsène Marie Lefeuvre, a painterdecorator from Sillé-le-Guillaume. creator of the iconic Bébé Cadum figure

The East wing of the castle, undergoing extensive restoration, will not feature the exhibition in 2025.













### Centuries of History

Former stronghold located at the crossroads of Maine, Brittany, and Normandy, Sillé-le-Guillaume was built around the life of its castle and collegiate church. From the medieval town to the industrial and commercial city, Sillé-le-Guillaume is also renowned for its natural surroundings and its famous site, Coco Plage.

Sillé-le-Guillaume owes its origins to two key figures. The first, a Gallo-Roman named Silius, built a domain on the slopes of the hill along the ancient road from Le Mans to Jublains. The second, Guillaume, the first Baron of Sillé, was tasked by the Count of Maine with defending this territory. In the 11th century, he built a castle that became the site of numerous battles. Severely damaged during the Hundred Years' War, the fortress, a fine example of military architecture from that period, was restored in the 15th century. In the 13th century, a chapter of canons was established, and the collegiate church was constructed above the lordly chapel. A canonical quarter was thus founded. The town was then divided by the stream, the Ruban, with the castle and the collegiate church on one side and the village, which grew around the Church of Saint-Etienne (destroyed during the Revolution), on the other.

Thanks to the passage of numerous pilgrims in the 12th century, a commercial and artisanal district emerged made up of weavers, blacksmiths, and innkeepers. From this time, the city maintained a strong commercial activity, eventually becoming one of the most trading cities in Upper Maine by the 18th century. The city then produced worsted wool, and hemp and linen fabrics. Its tanneries were highly regarded, and its fairs and markets

were very popular. In the 19th century, Sillé experienced new urban development that would strengthen the city's commercial reputation: a train station, roads, hotels, department stores, shops, and bourgeois houses...

### Did you know?

The illustrated postcard was invented in Sillé-le-Guillaume!

From September 1870 to January 1871, the 50,000 volunteer soldiers of the Breton Army were gathered in a camp at Conlie to prepare for battle and repel the Prussian army.

The soldiers, cramped in very harsh winter conditions, quickly ran out of basic necessities, including letter paper to send news to their families. Léon Besnardeau, a paper merchant and bookseller from Sillé-le-Guillaume, then came up with the idea of cutting small rectangles from the covers of notebooks whose pages he had already sold individually. These cards could be sent without an envelope. The front was adorned with allegories, war mottos, or the arms of Brittany. Initially, the cards were intended solely for the mobilized soldiers at the Conlie camp.





### The Collegiate Church of Sillé









### Centuries of History

The Church of Our Lady of the Assumption, a former collegiate church and castle chapel, is a fascinating site of Art and History. The church was built in two stages. In the 12th century, a Romanesque chapel was constructed, which is accessed via the south transept portal. Today, this chapel, known as the crypt, is reputed to be the largest in western France.

A hundred years later, a collegiate church was built — this comprises the entire structure visible today. It is accessed by a staircase. The church is adorned with an exceptional Gothic portal, around which a magnificent tympanum depicting the Last Judgement has been sculpted.

Inside the church, the 16th-century carved wooden stalls of the canons surround the altar. When you look up, a magnificent array of 19th- and 20th-century stained glass windows illuminates the space. Among them is a window telling the story of Jeanne-Marie de Maillé, Baroness of Sillé. You will also find several sculptures in wood, stone, and terracotta, as well as paintings listed as Historic Monuments.

Open all year round.







### **The Dovecote**

This dovecote was one of the most important in the region at the end of the 16th and beginning of the 17th century. It was part of a number of buildings that, in that era, made up the hamlet of Vassé.

A symbol of the Lords' power, the dovecote was used to raise pigeons for their meat and droppings. It is a round, tower-shaped structure containing 2,000 pigeon nesting boxes.

The Vassé dovecote was restored in 2001 by the village of Rouessé-Vassé. Following this restoration, it was awarded the "Trophée du Patrimoine de Pays" (Rural Heritage Trophy) in 2002 by the Pays de la Loire Region.

Step into history and discover this unique and well-preserved monument.



### The Castle of Vassé

Construction began at the end of the 16th century by Lancelot Grognet de Vassé, on the remains of a former fortified enclosure dating from the 11th and 14th centuries, whose towers once stood in moats fed by the Vègre river. Today, all that remains of the château is a large building ending on the east side with a broad square pavilion. This two-storey building, one floor featuring dormer windows, has eleven mullioned windows on its façade. The windows overlooking the Vègre are of Renaissance style (late 16th century), while the park-facing façade, with its projections, wings, and arched openings, dates from the early 17th century.

The terraced park opens through an entrance gate flanked by two large square pillars, reminiscent of the architecture from the reigns of Henri IV and Louis XIII. Within the park stands a small chapel dedicated to Saint Petronilla, built during the reign of Louis XIV.



#### The Lime Kiln

The lime kiln of Rouessé-Vassé is one of the most significant elements of the village's heritage.

In the case of Rouessé, the Jocaillé lime kiln was already in operation by 1777, initially fuelled by wood and later by coal. It was supplied with magnesian limestone from the adjacent quarry at La Régale (La Régale being the residence of the master lime burner). This enterprise employed around fifty local workers. The kiln was operated by the same family for at least three generations.

Its operation ceased around 1905, due to the emergence of chemical fertilisers, which competed with traditional liming practices. Since 1999, the village has owned both the lime kiln and the Régale house.





#### The Lamare cross


Sillé Forest

After the French Revolution, a man named Monsieur Lamare, consumed by grief and remorse for his revolutionary crimes, planted a wooden cross bearing a small statue of the Virgin Mary on the hillside. His devotion to the cross and the statue was noticed and then imitated. Fevers swept through the region, and many of the afflicted were healed after making pilgrimages to Our Lady of the Cross of Lamare.


Time and the elements caused Monsieur Lamare's cross and statue to disappear. A first oratory with a thatched roof was built, followed by a sturdier second one. Finally, in 1862, thanks to collections from the parishes of Rouessé-Vassé and Vimarcé, it was decided to build the chapel at the summit of the hill—the one that still stands today.



## Hiking & Mountain Biking in the Petite Charnie Forest



Covering an area of 716 hectares, this forest spans the communes of Saint-Symphorien, Neuvillette-en-Charnie, Parennes, Tennie, and Ruillé-en-Champagne. Its highest point reaches 187 metres, from which you can admire the Voutré quarries in Mayenne, the Sillé Forest, and the village of Parennes.

#### The Moreau Oak and the Camp of the Black Cow

During your hike, don't miss the "Moreau Oak," visible from the Petit Houx farm. This oak, the oldest tree in the forest (about 250 years old), is named after the forest keeper who, in 1928, was bought along with the forest—yes, the keeper was "bought"! In fact, before 1917, the forest belonged to the de Cars family, owners of Château de Sourches. When the state purchased the forest, they kept its guardian. In memory of this man, his name was given to the oak.

Also, stop by the Camp of the Black Cow. This historic site, marked by a calvary, was erected in 1893 by the de Cars family in memory of the Chouans.



## Le Château de Sourches



## Did you know?

During World War II, as the fear of art looting was growing, the Château de Sourches was requisitioned by the French state to safeguard certain works of art. In 1939, its vaulted cellars were used as a refuge for large paintings from the Louvre Museum, some furniture from the Château de Versailles, *the Bayeux Tapestry*, and important private collections belonging to Jewish families.

Among the most important works were The Raft of the Medusa, as well as works from the Trianon. It wasn't until 31st July 1946 that these works were able to leave the cellars of the Château de Sourches.

These events were brought to light in the film *Francofonia*, filmed at the Château de Sourches by Russian filmmaker Alexander Sokurov. The film, which explores the art collections of the Louvre during the occupation, was released in 2015.

#### A Gem of Architecture

Located 25 km west of Le Mans, the Château de Sourches is a masterpiece of neoclassical architecture and a significant site in French history. In the middle of its park, designed by Jules-Hardouin Mansart, stands the noble building designed by Gabriel for the Marquis de Sourches, Grand Prévôt of France. It is one of the rare large castles perfectly preserved in its original state. The château is built on an elevation, at the centre of the grand perspective of the park, and is preceded by a vast courtyard surrounded by dry moats.

## The Peony Conservatory

The Peony Conservatory gathers 3,021 peony plants, all meticulously catalogued. This unique conservatory in the world is home to a single family, the Paeoniaceae; shrub, herbaceous, intersectional hybrids, and botanical species all thrive together in harmony. The Peony Conservatory of Sourches aims to conserve and research both old and modern species and varieties. It also serves as a behavioural observatory for this divine flower. Thoughtfully planned plantings of botanical species and the deliberate proximity of certain varieties will, in the coming years, likely produce natural hybridizations or other mutations. While we await these small miracles of nature, the search for new varieties continues.

## Hidden Heritage Treasures



### Saint-Laurent Church

Built in the 12th century, Saint-Laurent Church is dedicated to Saint Lawrence, a martyr who was put to death on a gridiron. It was constructed under Saint Thuribe.

The church follows a Latin cross floor plan, with a prominent transept and a square tower at the crossing — features typical of Romanesque architecture. The detailing of the church's apse is particularly remarkable: it rests on capitals adorned with heads or geometric patterns, set atop slender columns.

#### Saint-Julien Church

The name of this church comes from a local legend claiming that the footprint of Saint Julian — apostle of the Maine region and first bishop of Le Mans — could be seen in a hollow of a roussard stone. According to the tale, he passed through the area while spreading Christianity in the Champagne Mancelle region. This modest church, with a single nave topped by an open bell tower, was built towards the end of the 11th century and has undergone several alterations over time.

On Saturday 20 April 2024, a ceremony was held at Saint-Julien-le-Pauvre to mark the completion of restoration work on the church's structure.





### Saint Peter and Saint Paul Church

This church is dedicated to both Saint Peter, the father of the Church, and Saint Paul, the evangelist. Of the original 15th-century building, only the chancel remains. The nave was rebuilt in 1766. In 1888, the bell tower — a belfry tower — was deemed unsafe and had to be demolished. Many restoration works were carried out in the early 20th century, largely thanks to Abbé Cossont, who was born in Bernay-en-Champagne. In 1916, a new bell tower was finally erected. Inside the sanctuary, you can admire several terracotta statues and an altar crafted in 1870 by René Hanuche, a stonemason from Sablé.




## The Chapel of La Roche Couasnon

Mr Hulot invites you to discover the Chapel of La Roche Couasnon — a marvellous 16th-century building, rich in history and charm! Nestled in the heart of the countryside near the Vègre River, this stunning chapel has been lovingly restored over the course of nearly 45 years, breathing new life into its beautiful stonework. Come and admire this exceptional site and let yourself be swept away by the fascinating stories and curious anecdotes shared by its passionate owner.

## Saint-Symphorien Church

The current church replaces an earlier sanctuary that was destroyed by fire. Apart from the religious furnishings, only a single round arch from the 11th century - located in the north sacristy - remains as a vestige of the original Saint-Symphorien Church. A written description has been preserved, offering insight into the layout of the original building, which featured a nave ending in a semi-domed apse and two transept arms dating from the 16th century.





## Saint-Corneille and Saint-Cyprien Church

This protected 12th-century church, once attached to the Abbey of La Couture in Le Mans, is considered one of the most beautiful churches in the Sarthe region.

It was built in the early 12th century from Bernay stone by the monks of La Couture Abbey.

### Saint-Martin Church

This remarkable church is listed on the "Clay Pathways". Around 1642, the church was enhanced with an outstanding decorative scheme, including two altarpieces in the chancel and the southern chapel.








### Château de la Renaudière

Life-size mannequins in uniforms, weapons, and military vehicles sit alongside everyday objects, wood sculptures of military scenes, and portraits of famous figures from the conflict. All of the thousands of items on display are authentic.

### The History of the Camp of Conlie

The Defeat of the French Army at the Hands of the Prussians, in September 1870, led the new republican government to form troops in response. The Conlie Camp was the first of the 11 defense and training camps created in France.

An initiative of General de Keratry, it mainly brought together conscripts from Brittany. Situated on the Jaunelière hill, it was established on 22nd October 1870 and could accommodate 50,000 men. Levelled prior to installation, the constant foot traffic and rain turned the camp into a quagmire, which came to be known as "Kerfank," the "mud city" in Breton.

With the first snowfall came the outbreaks of epidemics. The weapons promised by Gambetta, surplus from the American Civil War, never arrived. Under-equipped, poorly trained, and demotivated, the Breton army was further neglected due to suspicions of a potential Chouan army. By December, faced with this failure, part of the force was either recalled or evacuated to the forest of Sillé.

On 12th January 1871, 12,000 soldiers finally fought and fell with the Army of the Loire at Le Mans. This defeat was unfairly attributed to them. On 14th January, the Prussians destroyed the camp, and the last soldiers returned home. The Breton Army was officially dissolved on 7th March 1871.



## The Washhouse

Discover many well-preserved washhouses scattered across the region.

Discover the one in Conlie, built in the early 19th century. It was renovated in 2014 for the enjoyment of local residents and visitors.



## The Hemp Kiln

Then, visit the Conlie kiln, built in the early 19th century. It was renovated in 2014 for the enjoyment of local residents and visitors alike.



### The Foal Fair

The origins of this tradition are somewhat unclear, but it remains etched in the memories of the oldest locals.

They recall with affection the sound of the hooves of 3,000 foals converging on the village centre. They would pass through the village at dawn on the third Thursday of November.

After the transactions, some would be gathered at the station, where they were then transported by whole wagons to the farming regions of Northern France and even Belgium.



## The Hill of Caesar's Camp

Caesar's Camp, also known as the Castle Camp or Grand Gaigné Camp, is a mound of Callovian origin (a mass of clayey limestone covered with yellowish clay).

This mound is believed to have housed a fortified position from the Gallo-Roman period. Stone ruins remained for a long time before being destroyed. It is possible that this site once housed a Roman camp between two ancient Roman roads.



## Notre-Dame de l'Habit Chapel

Domfront-en-Champagne was one of the most important priories of the Augustinian abbey founded in 1070 at Beaulieu near Le Mans. The Notre-Dame de l'Habit Chapel was an annex of this priory. It stands next to a private manor that served as the residence for the prior of Domfront. The chapel is now owned by the local council and is listed in the supplementary inventory of Historic Monuments.

The inscription on the bell hanging from the gable dates back to 1689. Inside the building, you'll find a font and decorations from the early Renaissance.




## Verniette Chapel

The hamlet of Verniette lies at the crossroads of two ancient paths: the route from Conlie to the Gallo-Roman relay at Asnière, and the Roman road connecting Sillé-le-Guillaume to Neuvy-en-Champagne. In the middle of the garden, the former parish church has preserved its Romanesque portal. Inside, you'll find 13th-century frescoes and a beautiful altarpiece, which was classified as a Historic Monument in 1946 for its murals.

#### 1866

A mixed public school opens under the reign of Napoleon III. It witnesses the introduction of the Jules Ferry laws in 1882 and the separation of Church and State in 1905. Two schoolmistresses, Émilie Launay (1923–1942) and Marie-Louise Thureau (1942–1977), left a lasting mark on the life of the school.

#### ı 1983

Due to a lack of pupils, the school in Le Grez closes and the few remaining students transfer to schools in Sillé-le-Guillaume.

### **1998**

On the occasion of an agricultural fair, former pupils recreate the school as they once knew it and open it for visits.

#### **2013**

The association "Le Grez: School, Nature and History" is founded. It organises guided tours and events every year.

#### The School-Museum

Travel back in time and step into the shoes of a 19th-century pupil! Located in the village of Le Grez, in the heart of the Silléen bocage, on the edge of the forest, this charming old school is a treasure trove of memories for some and a delightful discovery for others.

What was taught at school in 1905? What did the Jules Ferry law change? What did the teaching materials of the time look like? Come and find out during a friendly visit full of fascinating anecdotes!

Annie Nicolaÿ and the volunteers from the association passionately share the history of the school. A former pupil herself, who later became a teacher, Annie introduces visitors to a rich collection of historical artefacts...

## Hiking & Mountain Biking in the Forest of Mézières

The Mézières Forest covers 480 hectares and, in 1423, provided most of the timber framework used to build Le Mans Cathedral. Today, this coniferous forest is home to many towering trees such as Douglas firs, pines, oaks, and chestnut trees. To explore this beautiful woodland, the Tourist Office invites you to follow the "Mézières Forest Circuit" — a loop of approximately 15 km. On foot or by mountain bike, venture into the heart of the forest where narrow paths and rolling terrain await!

## The Hemp Kiln of Degré

The hemp kiln is a testament to the hemp-growing industry that made the Sarthe the hemp-producing department in France during the 19th century. At the time, hemp was used to make ropes and clothing. These ovens posed a significant fire risk, which is why they were usually built away from the farm buildings. Each kiln includes two rooms: a heating chamber and a drying chamber. Two separate doors provide access to each space.



## Saint-Martin Church

Likely dating from the late Middle Ages, the church in Degré is dedicated to Saint Martin, the son of a Roman officer who joined the imperial cavalry at the age of fifteen. He is famous for sharing his cloak with a poor man and for a heavenly vision that led to his conversion to Christianity. Appointed Bishop of Tours in 372, Saint Martin is regarded as the evangeliser of western France.



#### The Greenwich Meridian

Neuvillalais is one of the few villages in France through which the Greenwich Meridian passes directly through its centre. A marker at the foot of the church commemorates this unique feature.

The Greenwich Meridian is marked by a line of paving stones running through the village centre, right in front of the church.

#### The Sundial

Discover the first analemmatic sundial in the Sarthe department, located in Neuvillalais. Set in the middle of a landscaped garden, this special sundial allows you to tell the time using the shadow of your own body!



## Saint-Rémy-de-Sillé Church


The church of Saint-Rémy-de-Sillé was likely built on the ruins of a Roman-era temple, as suggested by the fern leaf-style stonework in the walls, inspired by Roman architecture. In 1133, a priory was established and entrusted to the monks of the Abbey of La Couture in Le Mans. During the French Revolution, part of the church was used as the town hall, and a sacristy was added to extend the left-hand chapel.

### Saint-Nicolas Church

This small church, with its quaint sky-blue dome behind the chancel, originally served as the priory chapel. It is thought to have been founded in the 12th century.

The priest Jean Pocquelin, cousin of Molière, served as chaplain here from 1696 to 1703.

Le Grez once also had the chapel of Saint-Marie des Bois, located in the village, and the small chapel of Saint-Paul—locally known as Saint Pou—which still stands near the hamlet of Haut Éclair.

## The Chapel of the Virgin of Siméon

In the heart of the forest, just off the D<sub>3</sub>8, don't miss the Chapel of the Virgin of Siméon. In the 19th century, young women wishing to marry would come here on solitary pilgrimages to pray to the Virgin, offering flowers and coins.



### Saint-Mamert Church

The Church of Saint-Mamert was likely built in the 14th century and was linked to the manor of Les Aîtres, located on the hill known as "La Chapelle." Saint Mamert, Archbishop of Vienne (Isère) from 461 to 475, is known for introducing rogation days—three days of public prayer and supplication leading up to the Feast of the Ascension.
